Petri Kotwica. Born 1964. He is an award-winning Finnish film director and screenwriter. His first feature Homesick (2005) was lauded at numerous international festivals. His second feature Black Ice premiered



in Berlinale 2008 competition and was a box office hit in Finland. It won six national film awards and was screened at more than 50 film festivals. *Rat King* (2012) had its international premiere at Tribeca Film Festival in 2012. Kotwica has Master of Arts degree at the Helsinki University of Art and Design in 1999.

Armi Alive! Armi Elää!



Armi Ratia is the woman behind the legendary design company Marimekko and a worldwide celebrity. A theatre company has taken on the task of trying to portray the life and work of this complex person. The sets mainly consist of the well-known patterns that we all have grown to love. Armi is a brave, risk-taking businesswoman and her passion for her company repeatedly takes its toll on her employees, finances and family. The company grows while Armi's personal life is shaken by suicide attempts and turbulence. In Armi Alive!, Oscar-nominated film producer and director Jörn Donner portrays a fascinating woman with fervent ideas about the new Finnish man, her company, fabrics and clothes.

Jörn Donner. Born in Helsinki, Finland, in 1933. Has had a distinguished career as a film director, film producer, writer, and politician. His works have influenced the Finnish society for almost half a century, and still he



keeps on working as one of the most controversial characters in the Finnish cultural sector. Won an Academy Award as producer of Ingmar Bergman's Fanny and Alexander. Was CEO of the Swedish Film Institute 1978–1982. Donner's most famous films include Portraits of Women (1970) and Fuck Off! Images from Finland (1971).

Bridgend follows Sara and her dad, Dave, as they arrive to a small village in Bridgend County. The village is haunted by suicides amongst its young inhabitants, and Sara falls dangerously in love with one of the teenagers, Jamie, while Dave as the town's new policeman tries to stop the mysterious chain of suicides. The film is an uncompromising story focused on the relationship between vulnerable teenagers and their parents who are left in the dark as the inexplicable suicides gradually take on the character of a punishing ritual.

Jeppe Rønde. Born in Aarhus, Denmark, in 1973. Rønde worked as a professional musician until he graduated. He now holds a BA degree in Film Science and Art History from The University of Copenhagen. Jeppe



Rønde has directed feature films, commercials and documentaries since 2002. He had his feature lenght debut in 2003 with the documentary *Jerusalem My Love*. Apart from directing and often filming his documentaries, he has also composed the music to his films. *Bridgend* is his first feature film.

Brave Men's Blood Borgríki 2 - Blóð hraustra manna



In order to take down a major criminal organization, the ambitious head of the internal affairs unit of the Reykjavik P.D. decides to investigate a corrupt police lieutenant. Tipped off about the lieutenant's criminal dealings by a former crime kingpin, now imprisoned, he places a female former narc officer undercover to spy on him. These actions set him off on a dangerous path as he aims to catch both the lieutenant and the drug-lord.

Olaf de Fleur. Born in 1975 in Iceland. Founded his own independent production company, Poppoli Pictures, in 2003. The first production *Shining Star* won Best Documentary Feature award at the Icelandic Film Awards.



An award he won again in 2005 for the documentary Africa United. His first feature film The Amazing Truth about Queen Raquela won him the Teddy award for Best Feature at Berlinale in 2008 and was nominated for Best Nordic Film in 2009. His second feature Higher Force (2008) was a comedy that premiered at the AFI Film Festival. In 2011 Olaf released one documentary, Adequate Beings and two fiction features, City State and Polite People that together recieved 13 Edda Award nominations. City State is currently in a US remake process.

Gunnar and Sonja was a married couple that had it all, but after the death of their daughter their world falls apart. To make things worse Gunnar is in the middle of a trial, being charged with illegal sales and purchase on behalf of his company. When Gunnar and Sonja gets custody of Gunnar's niece Perla, the couple take on a weekend journey to pick her up. Perla is living in a remote house in the Icelandic country side where she lost both of her parents in a horrible way. When they arrive strange things start to happen. Perla seems to have an influence on Sonja that makes her want stay in the house, but Gunnar can't stand being there. Can he stay at the house for a whole weekend without loosing his mind? Is Gunnar the man Sonja think he is? Or will the truth come out?

Anton Sigurðsson. Born 1987. He is the second youngest person in the history of Icelandic Cinema to Direct a feature film. Anton was 25 when the principal shooting took place and *Graves and Bones* is his first feature



film, he also wrote the script. Prior to Directing *Grave* and *Bones* Anton directed two shorts, *Svartur Afgan* and *Secret And Lies*. Anton is an Icelandic Film School graduate where he majored in directing.






