

37' is inspired by a true story set in 1964, New York, where several neighbours witness the brutal murder and rape of Kitty Genovese, without intervening. In a New York Times article the neighbours are depicted as monsters that used her 35 minute fight for survival as their own entertainment, but given the reality of the time period, it is much more multi-faceted and complex. 37 tells the story of a few of these people and what led up to the night when they unexplainably remained passive observers. Inside their apartments the neighbours are dealing with their personal lives and conflicts the same way as they deal with witnessing a murder; if we don't see, hear or talk about it, then it didn't happen.

Puk Grasten. Born 1986 in Copenhagen, Denmark, she recently returned to Copenhagen to develop her next feature film after nine years in Paris and New York working in film. Puk Grasten received her M.F.A in filmma-



king from NYU Tisch Graduate Film program, where she made a short version of her debut feature film. The short premiered at Slamdance and won best student film at Big Apple Film Festival. Her debut feature film '37' attended the Film Independent producing lab and was supported by New Danish Screen at the Danish Film Institute.

Helena Bergström's new comedy-drama is a film where different family relations are brought to their heads during the year's most tolerant holiday.

Helena Bergström. Born in 1965 in Göteborg. She was educated at the Swedish national academy of mime and acting. Following a successful acting career on both stage and in film, which earned her several Guld-



bagge awards, Helena Bergström made her directorial debut in 2007 with *Mind the Gap*. It was followed by *So Different* in 2009, and in 2011 she directed *Miss Julie* at Stockholm City Theatre – which she also adapted for the screen with her feature film *Julie*.

Hannes Holm. The Swedish director, producer and actor Hannes was born 1962 in a suburb to Stockholm and his entrance to the film industry was rather coincidental. At a concert he ran into the Swedish director Birgit-



ta Svensson who offered him a role in her feature film. Hannes accepted which resulted in his acting debut in the feature Interrail (1981). Since then he has had several roles in different film and TV productions, and in 1994 he made his feature debut, En på miljonen, together with director-colleauge Måns Herngren. The award winning film was a success and the pair worked together until 2010 when Hannes Holm wrote and directed his own feature, Himlen är oskyldigt blå.

For 65 years more than 50.000 people have gone to him to be healed from illnesses and ill-doings, and he has never asked for a penny.

Margreth Olin. Born 1970 in Stranda, Norway, is a director and writer. She is educated at the University of Bergen and Høgskulen i Volda. Margreth Olin was titled the Year 2008 Norwegian by the Norwegian weekly



magazine Ny Tid. Her first feature documentary was *Dei mjuke hendene* which won several awards. Her real breakthrough came with the documentary *Kroppen Min* from 2002, for which she was awarded the Amanda-price for best documentary.

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The Garbage Helicopter Sophelikoptern



A gigantic dumpster breaks loose from a helicopter with a terrible crash. Meanwhile, an old Roma woman wakes up with a tremendous longing for her old wall clock. She calls a grandchild who promises to bring it to her. Two days later, three Roma youths climb into a car in order to take the wall clock to their grandmother. A strange journey along Sweden's long, winding highways begins and it proves to be rich in content despite the rather trivial purpose. The three youths have more questions than answers about the country they're travelling through for the first time.

Jonas Selberg Augustsén. Born 1974 in Boden, Jonas has directed and written the screenplay for several award-winning short films such as The Freedom Calf (2006), The Process (2007) and Autumn Man (2010). He



received the Bo Widerberg Scholarship in 2007 on the grounds that he in his own way lives up to Widerberg's motto Life at any cost. The Garbage Helicopter is the third film in a planned series of five, where Höstmannen and Myrlandet are the first two, where the spoken language is one of Sweden's five official minority languages. In Höstmannen the language was Meänkieli, in Myrlandet it was Sami and in The Garbage Helicopter the language is Romani.

The murder sent shockwaves through the jazz community, and the memory of the event still haunts those who knew the Morgans. This music documentary is a love letter to two unique personalities and the music that brought them together. A film about love, jazz and America with cinematography by Bradford Young (DOP Selma).

Kasper Collin. Kasper Collin, born 1972, is a Swedish filmmaker and producer based in Göteborg. He has made films such as the feature documentary My Name is Albert Ayler, one of the most well received theatri-



cally released documentaries in UK and US during 2007 and 2008, praised in papers such as Sight and Sound, New Yorker, Variety and LA Weekly. Kasper also works as a producer for other filmmakers, and gives lectures and masterclasses on filmmaking, producing and distribution. He was the chairman of the Independent Filmmaker's Organization in Sweden (Oberoende Filmares Förbund) between 2009 and 2014. I Called Him Morgan is Kasper's second feature film.

A charming romantic comedy by Óskar Jónasson whose films have traveled around the world since his debut Remote Control in 1992. Hubert is a shy and introverted young man working as a copywriter at an advertising agency. When he meets Hanna he immediately falls in love and nearly speechless, but he manages to untie his tongue and ask her out. By taking a shortcut around his own personality and instead imitating famous people and mutual friends, he manages to make her laugh. She, who just left a relationship, finds him entertaining and different. They move in together and as time goes his imitations become compulsive acts that take over his personality and threaten their relationship.

Oskar Jonasson. Oskar Jonasson, born 1963 in Reykjavík, is an Icelandic film director and screenwriter. His debut feature *Remote Control* (1993) was selected for Un Certain Regard at Cannes. He later directed the



award-winning *Reykjavík Rotterdam* (2008), which was remade into the US film Contraband (2012). In 2011, Jonasson co-directed the animation *Thor* which was widely successful internationally.

Former soldier of the Red Army special troops, Viktor Kärppä, has settled in Finland and would like to be a respectable family man. Kärppä makes a living doing all kinds of projects (not all of them completely legal), when he realises that his marriage is on the breaking point. Before Kärppä manages to work things out with his wife Marja he finds out that his trails have led him to a great danger as he has unwillingly become a part of the plan to assassinate the new democratic president of Russia. Soon both contract killers and security service are chasing after him. To save himself, his family and the president, Kärppä needs help from his police friend Korhonen and his brother Aleksei.

Lauri Nurkse. Born 1978 is an Helsinki-born freelancer director and actor who is known to be versatile talent with wide experience. His filmography as director includes expect for popular feature films, numerous,



beloved drama Tv-series, commercials, music videos and Tv-entertainment shows. Nurkse holds a Master's degree from the ELO/Helsinki Film School (Aalto University).

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The Mine Jättiläinen



A couple of years ago, the much-discussed Talvivaara mine in northern Finland gave rise to one of Europe's biggest environmental disasters ever. When a dam burst, hundreds of thousands of cubic meters of water polluted by heavy metals escaped. The result was vast areas of dead forest and noxious, poisoned water. The residents still cannot drink the local water or eat fish from the lakes. The Mine is the fictionalised, captivating story about the people behind the incident and the political and tactical games played before and after the disaster. The main character is an ambitious official named Jussi whose job at the environmental inspection agency puts him in a dilemma regarding what's morally right and, on the other hand, most personally beneficial.

Aleksi Salmenperä. Born 1973 in Finland, was selected as Best Finnish Film Director in 2007. His films A Man's Job and Producing Adults were selected as official Oscar entries for Finland.

The Model The Model



The film tells the story of young small-town girl Emma who travels to Paris, the capital of fashion, in order to realise her dreams of becoming a model. Life as an aspiring model is far from glamourous, with envious roommates, humiliating working conditions and brutal photographers. On a shoot, she meets star photographer Shane White and what starts out as disharmony of the highest order is quickly transformed into a passionate romance, which in turn becomes a dangerous obsession for Emma. Paris looks divine, as do the models and the photography locations. But this is also a painful reminder of the naivité and scarce logic of the teenage years.

Mads Matthiesen. Mads Matthiesen, born 1976 in Denmark, got a BA in comparative literature and rhetoric, 2005, and a MA in modern cultural studies 2009, both from Copenhagen University. He trained in film direction



at the film talent school Super16. Mads Matthiesen's debut *Teddy Bear* competed for a Dragon Award at GFF. *The Model*, just as *Teddy Bear*, has an amateur actor at the very epicentre of the film.

As the crisis threatens to split them apart, Hringur resolves to sort things out before it's too late.

Asgrímur Sverrisson. Icelandic Ásgrímur Sverrisson has made a number of films for television, documentaries and shorts. He is also a leading commentator on the cinema in Iceland and regularly appears as such on TV




