#### Work in progress: Our Time is Now (Vår tid är nu)

World War II is over and a new era is in prospect, but in the illustrious restaurant Löwander's, in the heart of Stockholm, time stands still. Its Manager, Gustaf Löwander, has used every means at his disposal, legal and illegal, to see the family business through the hard times, but when his younger brother Peter returns from military service, he soon discovers that the restaurant – and the Löwander family – face bankruptcy. An open power struggle soon breaks out and cuts right through the Löwander's, with the matriarch Helga also fighting to keep her family together. Their younger sister Nina falls in love with the kitchen boy Calle and story of impossible love across the class divide is set in motion.


