2022 marks the 23rd edition of Göteborg Film Festival's Nordic Film Market.

This year Nordic Film Market will take place in a hybrid format. A safe festival

To prevent getting infected or passing on COVID-19, we carefully follow the guidelines and regulations issued by the Swedish authorities. The festival has taken several measures to further increase your safety.

To limit the spreading, we have:

- Highly limited and assigned seating in all cinemas and venues.
- Extra-long breaks between screenings to avoid queues and crowding.
- · Queue fences in venues where queues can occur.
- · Regular disinfectant routines.
- · Hand sanitisers in all cinemas and venues.

To take part in events with an audience of more than 20 people:

- · Arrive early.
- Only take part in the festival events if you feel well and don't have any symptoms
- Present a valid vaccination certificate* and ID document (for guests under 18, an ID document is sufficient).
- Wash your hands often and use a hand sanitiser.
- · Keep a distance and avoid large crowds.

*For the vaccination certificate to be valid, it has to be connected to the EU Certificate Digital System, and it needs to include two vaccine doses, the last of which is at least two weeks before your festival visit. An exception is granted to people who have a negative PCR test result and a doctor's certificate.

NOTE: Proof of a negative test result or evidence of recovery from a Covid-19 infection will not be enough to enter events requiring a certificate.



Fuad (aka Food) just turned 16, the age where nothing matters more to him than his friends. Growing up together in the run-down housing development of southern Ryd, they know that the number one rule between buddies is loyalty. But when Fuad breaks this rule he suddenly finds himself alienated by those he holds most dear. Desperate and alone, he is willing to do anything to be accepted back again.

Izer Aliu (b. 1982) is an Albanian award-winning writer and director, born in Macedonia. He grew up in Sweden and Norway and since graduating from the Norwegian Film School in 2012, he has made films in various



places in the world. His first feature *Hunting Flies*, earned him the Norwegian Peace Film Award and the film was shortlisted for Norway's Academy Awards submission and he was awarded Amanda Award for Best Director in 2017. Aliu's first award winning TV-series, "Countrymen", was honoured with a special interpretation prize at the Cannes Series and got the award for best series voted by High School students at the festival 2021. "Countrymen" is nominated for the 2022 Nordic TV Drama Screenplay Award, presented at Göteborg Film Festival's TV Drama Vision.

Day by Day Dag för dag



Day by Day is a life-affirming dramedy showing us it's never too late to change one's life. On a RV journey from Sweden to Switzerland, five unlikely characters come together to fulfill an elderly man's last wish. Cross-generational friendships blossom, an autumn romance awakens and life-changing decisions are made.

Felix Herngren is a Swedish filmmaker and founder of production company FLX. Felix is behind some of Sweden's most well known series such as Solsidan, Bonusfamiljen, and feature Solsidan The Movie. In 1999,



he made his feature debut with comedy Adult Behavior. His second feature, comedy Every Other Week, was released in 2006. In 2010, Solsidan premiered with the broadcasters highest viewing of the decade and won multiple awards. In 2013, the feature adaptation of bestselling novel The 100-Year-Old Man Who Climbed Out of the Window and Disappeared, which Felix wrote and directed, premiered on Christmas Day, and is one of the all-time highest grossing films in Sweden. Felix has just premiered the adaption of Fredrik Backman's novel Anxious People for Netflix (dec-21).

The Emigrants Utvandrarna



The Emigrants is the story of Kristina Nilsson, a mother who leaves a poverty-stricken Sweden with her family in the 1850s and sets out on a long, dangerous journey, hoping to find a better life for herself and her children in America. The film is based on Vilhelm Moberg's much-loved suite of novels "The Emigrants", and the story is now being told on film for the first time from Kristina's perspective.

Erik Poppe is regarded as one of Europe's most experienced and compelling directors recognized for his work with actors and impeccably well-crafted multi-pronged narratives. His movies are often built around



strong ensemble casts, sharp writing, impressive camera work and an uncanny knack for rhythm and music in the editing. During the last decade Poppe has become one of the most frequently awarded film directors from Scandinavia. *Hawaii,Oslo* and *The King's Choice* both won Best Film at The Amanda Awards in Norway, while *Troubled Water* won the Golden Starfish for Best Film plus the Audience Award, at the 16th Hamptons International Film Festival in the US. The film *Utøya 22.juli* attended the main competition in Berlin in 2018.

Johan shares his family farm with the wild horse Ella and a whole lot of dynamite. Johan loves Ella and massive explosions, but not much else. Except for Solvor, the girl next door. The love of his life. And the one he accidentally blew up a bit during his younger days.

Hallvar Witzø is a film director working from Oslo. He graduated from The Norwegian Film School in 2010 with the short film Tuba Atlantic, which won the Student Academy Awards for Best short film in 2011. The



short film Yes We Love (2014) competed for the Palm d'Or at Cannes Film Festival and received First Honorable Mention. Witzø has directed a slew of Norwegian commercials and known TV-dramas such as Helt Perfekt (TVNorge), Kjære Landsmenn (TV2) and Neste Sommer (TVNorge). The comedy Everybody Hates Johan (2022) is his feature film debut, produced by Nordisk Film Production.

Through the making of a short documentary, she becomes closer to her dad Patrick, 62, and her cousin Faustine, 17, who share the same dream: leaving the village.

Morgane Dziurla-Petit. Born in France, Morgane Dziurla-Petit studied film in Paris and Cannes. She moved to Sweden in 2017, where she has made three short films acclaimed by approximately 100 festivals around



the world: Le Jour (2018), Excess Will Save Us (2019 – Guldbagge 2020 Best Short Film) and Grab Them (2020). She is now premiering her first feature, Excess Will Save Us, a film inspired by her short of the same name, is in the Tiger Awards Competion in Rotterdam.

Alli Haapasalo (b. 1977) is a Finnish director and writer and holds an MFA from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, as well as a BA from Aalto University's School of Film, Television and Scenography. With her



third feature film Girl Picture she continues her passion to tell strong female driven stories. Haapasalo's feature debut Love and Fury (2016) followed a writer finding her own voice. Force of Habit (2019) – written and directed by a collective of seven writer-directors - dealt with gender bias and structural misuse of power.

Hatching Pahanhautoja



Hatching is about a 12-year-old gymnast girl who desperately tries to please her demanding mother, a woman who loves to put her perfect family and perfect life on display in her popular video blog. One night the girl finds a strange bird's egg, hides it and keeps it warm until it hatches something shocking. Combining drama and horror, Hatching is a growth story about a mother-daughter relationship and lovelessness that creates a monster. The film is like a modern version of a Grimm's fairy-tale.

Hanna Bergholm is a Finnish film director. She has graduated in 2009 from the University of Art and Design Helsinki with MA in Film Directing. She has directed several internationally awarded short films and also TV



drama series. Her latest short horror film *Puppet Master* has been selected to several international film festivals including Fantasia Film Festival in Montreal and Fantastic Fest in Austin 2018, and also to the Museum of Modern Art New York 2019. *Hatching* is her first feature film.

Elina, an aspiring young rapper, moves to the South of France along with her mother and falls for her new step-sister, mesmerizing ballerina, Sofia. But when Elina realizes Sofia just plays with her, Elina's love turns into obsession - with toxic consequences.

Aino Suni (1985) is a Helsinki-based director and screenwriter who makes fiction and documentary films. She has studied MA in Film Screenwriting in Salford University, Great Britain in 2014. Heartbeast is her first feature



fiction. Suni's first feature documentary, about rapartist Mercedes Bentso, Never Again (2018), was selected into Tampere Film Festival and Love & Anarchy festival.



The remaining brothers lives have taken different paths, but they all have one thing in common - they drink too much. Their relationship is tense but Johanna is determined to unite them again before it's too late.



Johanna Bernhardson, born 1974 in Gothenburg, is specialized in the short documentary format and in essayfilms. Her films take place close to herself and are very personal, yet she touches upon universal themes. Johanna has a MFA in Set Design from HDK - School of Design and Crafts, and a Master in Film from Valand




